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Student Readiness for Online Learning

<i>Readiness Area</i>	<i>Information to Provide</i>
Course Types	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clear definition of an online course as compared to other courses, including those that are offered in a face-to-face format
Online Course Sample	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A live online course showing examples of various online course components: discussions, quizzes, project areas, grades, etc. • Narrated video walking a potential student through what a typical day in an online course might look like
Technology Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Specific language indicating all the technology that a student would need to have available in order to have a seamless technological experience in an online course <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Browser and browser versions ○ Screen resolutions ○ Plug ins, i.e., Macromedia Flash Player ○ Internet connectivity speeds ○ Microsoft Office version requirements ○ Any course-specific software ○ Downloads available from institution via institutional licenses ○ Speakers/headsets ○ Antivirus software (some institutions will not allow access to local resources without meeting certain levels of virus protection) ○ Hardware and software platform issues (mac vs pc) that may or may not be encountered • Include screenshots on where students might find needed technology that is available for free download, i.e., Macromedia Flash Player, java, etc. • Include a helpdesk number for answering questions • Processor speeds • Video card requirements • Operating system • RAM • Laptop/desktop

Benefits/Disadvantages	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explanation of why some students elect to take online courses and others do not • Testimonials or short video clips of students that have taken online courses • Estimates of how much time an online course can take • Data on success rates of online courses • Profiles of students that are particularly successful in online courses (work commitments, family commitments, age, etc.)
FAQs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An updated list of frequently asked questions addressing each of the areas described above • Include institutional contact information in this area (chat, email, phone, etc.)
Other Considerations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Delivery of student readiness assessments <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Online ○ Face-to-face ○ CD • Mandatory vs required • Distribution <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Incrementally spread over an entire term ○ Just-in-time format organized by topic area ○ Prior to start of classes • Offering delivery <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Learning technology centers ○ Information technology labs ○ Faculty member: in-course ○ Student life: at admission orientation ○ Advising: at enrollment
